Mr. Cavanaugh will self-represent in this case with the consultative support of Mr. Kevin Fitzgerald, who may be entered into the case later near trial.

Mr. Cavanaugh has self-represented for the last 3 years in his defense in civil litigation and during bench trial, presenting to judge Crosby for no less than 5 days, and at trial approximately 15 days total, doing cross examinations and other typical trial activities. He has filed many motions, and perhaps not less than 1000 pages of materials of his own production.

Mr. Cavanaugh can afford his attorney after considering his financial position, and will benefit from self-representation initially for cost reduction but also to work on the case anytime, up to 24 hours per day, which is not possible or affordable for any hired attorney. Mr. Cavanaugh can file rapidly, anytime, at all hours, while it appears his appointed defense attorney cannot.

Mr. Kevin Fitzgerald is uniquely knowledgeable about the Civil Case which is relevant to the present case. He will not need to relearn conditions surrounding the current Criminal Case that directly relate to the earlier Civil Case. It would take years for others to attain his level of knowledge about the present case.

Mr. Cavanaugh would like this change to be made active immediately. Ms. Masha Kazakova was assigned, and he is happy to have gotten this assignment; however, Mr. Cavanaugh simply prefers to continue self-representing in his own interests, and it appears she wasn't quite able to represent him based on conversation. He is abundantly and perhaps excessively capable, and has other relevant experiences not listed which lend to that same conclusion, and will be a better self-represented attorney than most.
